With two major events under our belts, our first Friendship Connect Event and our first SAlLing Lessons, SAlL's mission to inspire families to create and develop their own housing solution for their loved one has received a great response. SAlL is happy to announce that in just one month, over 15 families have joined SAlL.

In the months to come, we hope that number will double. And as we grow, so will the opportunities to get involved. In our next newsletter, SAIL will post several volunteer opportunities specific to our committees.

SAIL Launches Website

For \$30 per year (your registration in 2021 will carry you through all of 2022) you will have full website access including <u>SAILing to your IDD Housing Solution</u>, a guide created by parents for parents to address some key steps to consider as you develop a plan to move your loved one into a housing solution, over 50 resource documents

to help you develop your model, access to SAIL's Friendship Connect online portal and free admission to SAILing Lessons (SAIL's mentorship and education initiative) and Friendship Connect events.

We also had more than 20 volunteers present, so the room was abuzz with conversation. Guests participated in decorating name tags, a scavenger hunt, hat decoration, yarn bracelet braiding, arts and crafts, a photo booth, "Basket Heads" ball toss, corn hole and giant Jenga challenges. The "Rock'em Sock'em" robots attracted plenty of competitors, too!

SAILing Lessons

SAILing Lessons- Planning, Dreaming and Working Together

On Nov. 3, 2021, twenty families gathered together for SAIL's inaugural SAILing Lesson. "The SAILing Lessons" initiative provides a forum for families to come together as partners to encourage and empower one another to develop a plan to launch their loved one into a happy, fulfilled, interdependent life and living situation.



SAILing Lessons

In our first lesson, participants learned about the SAIL organization and the resources that are available at www.sailhousingsolutions.org. The Mueller family inspired us with their journey of launching their daughter into an apartment with two other young women. Susan Rogers, LMSW, ACSW shared some resources and stories from her 25 years of experience helping people with IDD live independently.

Families split into individual work groups to talk about their dreams and challenges for their loved ones. Safety, location, and finding support staff bubbled to the top of the list of challenges discussed in the individual work groups. Many of the participants expressed gratitude regarding SAIL's mission and appreciated the opportunity to meet other parents.

The evening concluded with questions and answers from the participants and SAILing Lessons Chairperson, Sara Fentress-Gannon.

Our next SAlLing Lesson is **January 5**, **2022** and we will further our discussions on how to best protect our most vulnerable people, while allowing them to live full and independent lives. Keep an eye on our website and your email for more information!

Rochester Housing Solution Update

Much activity occurred over the summer months for the families of

Rochester Housing Solutions (RHS) – a group of families working with Bill Godrey and Three Oaks Communities to build integrated I/DD housing in Rochester Hills. By the end of October, a total of 10 families will have completed the customized training based on the Center for Independent Futures' program preparing families to work together on this housing initiative.



Membership in RHS is increasing and connections with the community are A formal organizational arowina. structure has been established. Housing options are beginning to work their way through the City zoning and planning processes. Member families gathered twice this summer; first, to review the site plan for Walton Oaks (a potential site of future I/DD homes off of Walton Boulevard) and to aet an update on the other two Rochester Hills sites; then, in September for an update from the interim board, general organization update and bowling for the young adults.

RHS has formed an operating committee to lead the organization and functional committees in areas such as marketing, public relations, development, and support services/technology. The website is under review and will be refreshed during the fall.
