



Partner Families Why are they important?

Identifying those families with whom you share commonalities which will foster sustainability and success in your housing model.

Developing a housing solution requires:

- Teamwork
- A shared vision
- Communication
- Commitment
- Shared Interests or similar level of need to sustain a supportive Housing Model

• Active: VOLUNTEER! Be part of a committee or just volunteer at an event to create community






